Theft from Unsecured Parked Vehicles

Thanks to an aware Pleasanton resident, two local thieves were caught before they could get away with stolen property.

On the August 21, 2017, at about 2:37 a.m., a resident on Alvord St called the Pleasanton Police Department to report she was watching two suspicious people look into parked vehicles while attempting to open the vehicles' doors. The resident provided the Pleasanton Police Department with the suspects' descriptions as well as live updates regarding their activity. Eventually the resident reported the suspects had entered a vehicle parked on the street.

Pleasanton officers arrived on scene within moments of the initial phone call and did a search of the area. The officers quickly located two subjects, Jeremy Griego, a 28 year old male from Hayward, and Miriam Bahram, a 29 year old female from San Leandro. Bahram was found hiding behind a vehicle parked on a residential driveway and Griego was located while pretending sleep inside a stolen 1995 Volvo 850. Bahram was in possession of stolen property from two of the vehicles parked on Alvord St. Officers also found several burglary tools on Griego's person including a window punch, vice-grip plyers, a screwdriver, and a flashlight.

A search of the stolen vehicle by the officers produced several potentially stolen items, including Amazon merchandise boxes with shipping addresses in Livermore and Pleasanton. In addition, officers found 5g of methamphetamine and a glass smoking pipe. Griego and Bahram were both arrested and booked at the Santa Rita Jail for multiple charges.



Better Together

This incident is another example of an alert Pleasanton resident who quickly called 9-1-1 when she witnessed what she recognized to be criminal activity. Much of the police department's success is thanks to a unique partnership with the Pleasanton community. The Pleasanton Police Department would like to take this opportunity to remind Pleasanton residents to lock the doors of their vehicles when they are unattended.
