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### **HUMAN SERVICES COMMISSION LOOKS AT HOMELESSNESS AND OTHER ISSUES IN SERIES OF WORKSHOPS TO UPDATE STRATEGIC PLAN**

PLEASANTON, Calif. — The Human Services Commission is hosting five public workshops to engage the public and local social service agencies in an update to the Human Services Needs Assessment Strategic Plan. The first workshop on homelessness will be held on Wednesday, November 1, 7-9 p.m. in City Council Chambers, located at 200 Old Bernal Ave.

Workshops will be held from November through January and cover five special interest areas – homelessness, senior services, behavioral health, transportation services and access, and domestic violence and child abuse.

“We hope to engage the public and local social service agencies by giving them a platform to communicate what they believe we need in our community relative to human services. We also want to identify local service gaps and challenges in our ongoing effort to collaborate more effectively,” said Jay Ingram, community services manager for the City of Pleasanton.
