Updated Information: Body matching description of Philip Kreycik found on the Pleasanton Ridge

Today, at approximately 2:30 p.m., a citizen volunteer in the search for Philip Kreycik (37) found a body matching Philip's description in the north area of the Pleasanton Ridge. We are unable to confirm the identity of the person located at this time. At this preliminary stage of the investigation, the individual's cause of death is unknown, and the Alameda County Coroner's Bureau will work to identify the deceased. Our thoughts are with the Kreycik family and we are focused on supporting them during this difficult time.

Officers and detectives from both the Pleasanton Police Department and the East Bay Regional Park District Police Department are at the scene investigating and recovering any pertinent evidence. The location where the body was found is part of the East Bay Regional Park District jurisdiction and is approximately a quarter mile outside of Philip's intended route.
