


Olivia Gordet—Summer Camp Director (Summer Seekers & Explorers)

Pleasanton Trails

Get outside and explore one of Pleasanton's picturesque trails or parks. Here are a little information about a few of the trails in the city of Pleasanton!

Marilyn Murphy Kane

The Marilyn Kane Trail lies within the City owned 318-acre Bernal property. The 1.4-mile long trail follows the Arroyo de la Laguna from the trail staging area, southward to Bernal Canal, then northeast along the Bernal Canal to Valley Avenue. The trail is a link in a future regional trail that will extend north to Concord, and south, through Niles Canyon to the Bay. Marilyn Murphy Kane trail features stunning views of the Ohlone Wilderness to the south, Mt. Diablo to the north and Pleasanton Ridge to the west. Benches are placed along the trail at view sites. Prominent features in the southwest corner of the trail and in the southeast corner of Lagoon Drive and Valley Avenue are large man-made retention basins which are homes to ducks, geese and many other birds.

Augustin Bernal

The Augustin Bernal Community Park is a 237-acre open space community park in the City of Pleasanton offering outdoor recreation and educational opportunities for visitors of all ages and abilities. Located on the top and east face of the Pleasanton Ridge, the park provides hiking, biking and equestrian trails with spectacular views, plus

opportunities to explore a vestigial landscape that is disappearing in California. Sharing large sections of its west, south and north boundaries with East Bay Regional Park District's Pleasanton Ridge Regional Park, the park protects a valuable portion of the ridge and also secures a link in a "necklace of green," nearly encircling San Francisco Bay.

Callippe Preserve

Callippe Preserve Trail is a 3.75-mile long trail which loops around the Callippe Preserve Municipal Golf Course in the City of Pleasanton. Surrounding the golf course are 280-acres of permanent open space which includes 173-acres retained under City-ownership, and a 107-acres of the Koopmann Ranch through a conservation easement. Public access through the City-owned open space is provided by the Callippe Preserve Trail which offers spectacular views to the golf course and the outlying Tri-Valley area.

Eric Nicholas, City Naturalist:

"My current favorite park is The Preserve which is located at 5800 Laurel Creek Dr. It is a wonderfully expansive park that has some of the most breathtaking views of Pleasanton and the surrounding towns. During the summer one can see Red Tailed Hawks soaring high above, or if you carefully scan the rolling hills, you may be lucky to site a bobcat. Go check out this beautiful and secluded location!"



Learn to Swim

About Learn to Swim

The American Red Cross Learn-to-Swim Program offers swimming lessons for youth ages 4 and up. Weekday lessons are organized into four (4), two (2) week sessions with classes available in both the morning and evening. The descriptions below can be used to determine the most appropriate level for your child. Session dates and times can be found in the preceding pages. You may register for one session or all four (4). Saturday and private/semi-private lessons are also available.

Ages 3.5–5

Preschool

Throughout the three levels, preschool-age children are taught basic aquatic safety and swimming skills, all the while increasing their comfort level in and around the water. Skills are age-appropriate, helping children achieve success on a regular basis. Certified Water Safety Instructors will assess your child's skill level on the first day of class and will determine the most appropriate level placement at that time.

Ages 6 and up

Beginner (Level 1–3)

Instructors will determine child's level (1-3) on the first day of class.

Beginner (Level 1): This level is to help students feel comfortable in the water and begin the steps needed to swim.

Beginner (Level 2): Students will continue to learn to float on their front and back; will begin to explore forward movement and the foundations of additional strokes.

Beginner (Level 3): Students will build on skills learned previously and will be introduced to skills needed to take more advanced courses. Headfirst entries and rotary breathing are introduced.

Ages 8 and up

Stroke Improvement (Level 4)

In this class, students develop confidence in the strokes already learned while they improve upon other aquatic skills such as diving, turns and feet-first surface dives; as well as learn new strokes (breast-stroke, back crawl, sidestroke, and butterfly).

Ages 8 and up

Stroke Refinement (Level 5)

Students will refine their coordination and performance of all strokes and increase endurance and distance. Flip turns are introduced. To pass, students must perform a shallow dive into deep water, swim front crawl for 50 yards, maintain position on back for 2 minutes in deep water by floating or sculling, and then swim elementary back-stroke for 25 yards. In addition, they must also swim breaststroke for 25 yards, tread water for 2 minutes and swim back crawl for 50 yards.

Ages 8 and up

Personal Water Safety (PWS) & Fitness Swimmer (FS) (Level 6)

Once students have mastered the 5 levels of the Learn-to-Swim program, they may choose Personal Water Safety or Fitness Swimmer. Personal Water Safety focuses on skills that prepare participants for the lifeguard training and water safety instructor courses. Fitness Swimmer will help students achieve a higher level of aquatic fitness/endurance swimming or enter into competitive swimming.

Important notes regarding Learn to Swim Lessons

It is essential that each lesson is attended to receive the full benefit of the class. There are no make-up lessons or credits for missed classes. If the Community Services Department cancels a class or session, a credit will be issued to your account. All Learn to Swim classes are held at the Dolores Bengtson Aquatic Center and are taught by American Red Cross Certified Water Safety Instructors.
