

WATER SHORTAGE IN PLEASANTON

The City of Pleasanton is in short supply of water due to California's state of drought. City Council has declared the City in Water Shortage and is requesting all water customers take *immediate action* to reduce water use during this water shortage emergency.

To protect future water supply, the City requests all customers eliminate water waste as a way of life! **The current Water Use Restrictions are shown below in red.** Water use prohibition violations are subject to citation/penalty, and possible water shut off. The requirements outlined in gray are provided as a reference for possible actions required in future escalation of water shortage conditions.

ALL Water Supply Conditions

- Prohibited: Outdoor watering between 9 am – 6 pm (hand-watering & drip irrigation are excluded).
- Prohibited: Outdoor watering that results in water runoff.
- Prohibited: Hosing down driveways, sidewalks, or other hardscape.
- Prohibited: Allowing water to escape from breaks for more than 8 hours upon notification.
- Prohibited: Outdoor watering during periods of rain.
- Restaurants: Requested to serve water only upon customer request.

Stage 1 Voluntary Restrictions

- Outdoor watering is limited to 2 days per week, which may not occur on consecutive days.
- Use covers on swimming pools when not in use, and repair water feature leaks in 72 hours.
- No hose washing of hard-surfaced areas.
- Commercial customers: Post water conservation message on bathroom lavatory mirrors.

Stage 2 Mandatory Restrictions

- Stage 1 restrictions shall be in effect and shall be mandatory, with the following additions:
- Outdoor watering is limited to 2 days/week April-September on an even-odd schedule; properties with even street addresses water on even days of the month (no watering on the 31st day of the month)
- Washing of autos, trucks, etc., shall not occur more than once per month, & only with bucket & shut-off nozzle equipped hose, (no wastewater may enter storm drain)

Stage 3 Mandatory Restrictions

- All Stage 1 & 2 restrictions shall be in effect and shall be mandatory, with the following additions:
- *Thru 25% Mandatory Reduction:* All outdoor watering is limited to hand-watering using shut-off nozzle equipped hose, drip, or subsurface irrigation to no more than two days per week on an odd-even schedule (no watering on the 31st day of the month).
- Draining & refill of swimming pools is prohibited.
- Washing of autos, trucks, etc., only permitted at commercial car wash facilities.
