What is Green building?



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By building smart and healthy you are investing in your future. Green building has many benefits to yourself, your community, and your planet. As a bonus, building green could save you money and make your building/home more marketable.

Save Money

Green building products and construction practices can lower water and energy bills, reduce maintenance costs, and require less frequent replacement. Some rebates are offered by the electricity company for purchasing Energy-Star appliances.

Making Money

Having a green building gives you a marketing nitch. There are buyers that want green. If you have it, they will buy it.

Live More Comfortably

With good energy design, proper installation, and efficient heating and cooling systems, Green Building helps to ensure that your building/home is more comfortable.

Healthier Indoor Environment

Green Building encourages the use of materials, paints, and finishes that eliminate many sources of indoor air pollution, such as off-gassing of toxic fumes and materials that contain formaldehyde.

Good for the Environment

Conventional building construction and operation needlessly consume large quantities of wood, water fuel, and other materials. A green built building/home conserves these natural resources. This means less landfills, more trees stay in the forests, and less pollution is created.

How can you be Green?

Whether you are a builder, owner, or a buyer, you can be GREEN. As a builder, you will need to make yourself familiar with the green products that are available to design your project with (Large commercial structures and single family homes, alike). If you are an owner, then you will want to look at your house/building and any improvements (remodeling or new construction) that would allow you to upgrade to a Green building/home. If you are a buyer, you should contact a real-estate agent that is knowledgeable with the practice of green building and can help you find a Green home or Commercial building that has incorporated the Green

How Green is GREEN?

The City of Pleasanton requires a certain level of Green for specific projects, such as all City constructed projects, Commercial projects over 20,000 square feet in size, all civic projects, and new homes over 2,000 square feet, and for some special residential projects (additions to new homes, multifamily projects, productions homes, and PUD developments).

All other projects are encouraged to build as Green as possible. The Planning staff will offer help to anyone trying to incorporate green practices.

There are different shades of green. Some budgets only allow the developer to use green finishings, such as recycled content carpet, low VOC paint, and/or to install PV systems (solar power). While some projects are able to gain the greatest benefit by the whole green design approach. The site, time, and/or budget constraints will determine how green your project will be.
