Now every person in Pleasanton can express community pride and environmental awareness by adding "green steward" to their job description. Pleasanton Garbage Service and the City of Pleasanton now offer a Single Stream Commercial Recycling Program, which includes:

- Onsite assessment by PGS of your recycling potential
- Delivery of one 96-gallon Single Stream Recycling Cart
- Weekly pickup service

The Single-Stream method has proven to increase recycling volumes because it does not require participants to sort and separate recyclables. Once PGS picks up combined recyclables, they are separated into categories for transport to appropriate recycling facilities.

How to Recycle at Work!

Combine paper, cardboard, cans, plastic bottles, and glass bottles and jars in the same Single-Stream Recycling Cart or designated container. Place your cart outside on service day. It must be in an area accessible for automated recycling truck pickup.

narrow-neck plastic bottles and jugs (#1-7) and wide-mouth containers



aluminum, steel, tin cans and foil



glass bottles and jars



newspaper and magazines



shredded paper



Pack into a paper bag and securely tape it closed.



cardboard and paperboard boxes
Flatten to fit into cart.
