Man Attacked Outside His Home

On the morning of Saturday, September 21st, 2013, at 12:11 am, Pleasanton Police Dispatch received a 911 call regarding an altercation. Emergency personnel responded to Middleton Place and located a man lying unconscious in the street. Through further investigation, it was determined that there had been several subjects, possibly teen-agers, outside the residence making noise. The victim went outside to speak to the offending individuals and was involved in an altercation. The victim's wife came outside moments later and found her husband lying injured in the street. The victim was transported by ambulance to Eden Hospital where he spent several weeks receiving treatment for a head injury.

UPDATE

The Pleasanton Police Department completed its comprehensive investigation into the incident leading to the injury sustained by Mr. David Lamont on September 21, 2013 on Middleton Place in Pleasanton. During the investigation Pleasanton Police Detectives worked in collaboration with the Alameda County District Attorney's Office and kept them informed of developments and leads in the case. After careful evaluation and review of the facts, the Alameda County District Attorney has chosen not to pursue criminal charges citing lack of sufficient evidence to conclude a public offense was committed. The case has been closed and no further investigation is pending. Pleasanton Police Detectives have remained well connected with the Lamont Family throughout the investigation and have continuously updated them on the status and findings. The Lamont family has requested that no further media attention be given to the case and that they not be contacted for comment as they would simply like to put the incident behind them and continue to focus on healing. The Lamont family would also like to express their appreciation for the outpouring of community support they have received throughout this incident.
