Assault with Deadly Weapon

On January 26, 2014 at 0054 hrs the Pleasanton Police Department received a 911 call for shots being fired inside the Red Coats British Pub & Restaurant located at 336 St Mary St. Officers arrived on scene and quickly learned the suspect had fled prior to their arrival through the south exit of the restaurant. Witnesses reported seeing a male subject inside the restaurant pacing and acting strange just before the shooting began. Witnesses heard popping sounds and saw a lone suspect with a silver handgun shooting into the ceiling of the main bar area from a stairwell at the rear of the business. Most of the bullets struck the ceiling area however; one bullet struck a patron on his left buttocks. The patron did not immediately know he was struck until a friend saw he was bleeding. The victim was transported to Eden medical center where he was treated for a non-life threatening wound.

The suspect was described as White or light skinned Hispanic male, in his 20s, approximately 5'6" tall and 140 pounds wearing a black short sleeved shirt and blue denim jeans. Anybody with information about this crime is asked to contact the Pleasanton Police Department at (925) 931-5100.

Red Coats Pub Shooting Update – Suspect in Custody

On January 26, 2014 at 2:30pm, Pleasanton Police Detectives arrested 21 year old Jason Landes-Caballero of Pleasanton for the shooting at Red Coats British Pub & Restaurant. During his arrest, Landes-Caballero was in possession of methamphetamine. He was booked at Santa Rita Jail for assault with a deadly weapon, negligent discharge of a firearm, and possession of a controlled substance.

A search warrant of Landes-Caballero's residence was executed and evidence related to these crimes was seized. Information leading to the timely arrest of Landes-Caballero is credited to the members of the public who came forward and provided valuable leads.
