Free Job Search and Resume Writing Available at Library *Improve Job Search Skills and Resume Throughout Summer*

Pleasanton, CA—Experienced employment recruiters will be on hand to offer free counseling to any individuals interested in bolstering their job search skills or working to either create or improve their resumes.

“Anyone who has gone through a job search process knows that the search itself can sometimes be a full-time job,” said Julie Farnsworth, Director of the Pleasanton Library.

The consultation sessions are geared towards people who are entering the workforce for the first time, changing jobs or re-entering the workforce after a hiatus, and the counselors are all experienced employment recruiters with the requisite training to help people improve their marketability as well as their resumes.

The program has at least two employment recruiters on hand to provide individual consultations for anyone who signs up. Interested individuals can sign up for 20, 30 or 60-minute consultation sessions.

Appointments are available on selected Wednesday evenings, as well as on Thursday and Saturday afternoons, though additional appointment times have been recently added to accommodate demand. Anyone interested in signing up can do so, either in person at the Reference Desk in the Library or by calling 925.931.3400 ext. 4.

In addition to the trained employment counselors, the Library also has support materials available.

Library services are free and open to everyone.
