TWO WORKSHOPS FOR STUDENTS TRANSITIONING TO A NEW SCHOOL

Free Workshops Designed to Ease Transition

PLEASANTON, *Calif.* — The City of Pleasanton's FREE Community Education Series continues with two workshops geared towards students on the cusp of transitioning to a new school. Both workshops will be held on Wednesday, April 27, 2016 at the Pleasanton Public Library, located at 400 Old Bernal Ave.

Transitioning into Middle School—This first workshop, which will run from 4 – 5 p.m., is for 5th graders and their families, who are invited to a panel discussion to learn how to make a successful transition from elementary school to middle school. Transitioning into High School—The second workshop will run from 7 to 8 p.m. and is designed for students and families of 8th grade students who will be making the transition from middle school to high school. Registration is recommended. Go to pleasantonfun.com and enter course code #61607.

Both workshops will provide targeted information, tools and resources for students to ensure that whatever transition they are making—from elementary school to middle or from middle school to high school—will be successful. The panels will include students, parents and an administrator from the Pleasanton Unified School District. Students and families will have their questions answered regarding the social experience of moving from one school to the next, work load and homework, friendships, and preparing for the next phase of education.
