Update: In-Custody Death Investigation

Pleasanton, CA – On Wednesday, August 1, 2018, Pleasanton Police patrol officers responded to a disturbance call at 5420 Sunol Boulevard. Officers arrived within four minutes of being dispatched and contacted 38 year old Jacob Bauer of Pleasanton. When officers attempted to detain Bauer, he failed to comply with requests to place his hands behind his back. Bauer resisted officers' attempts to place him in handcuffs, including scratching and biting officers.

Officers struggled to place Bauer in handcuffs for over five minutes. During this time an electronic control device was used. Once Bauer was detained in handcuffs, he continued to struggle with officers. Ultimately a leg restraint device was used to safely transport him via ambulance to Stanford Valley Care for routine medical clearance.

As paramedics placed Bauer into the ambulance, he displayed signs of respiratory distress. Paramedics provided immediate medical aid and transported him to Stanford Valley Care where life-saving measures were taken. Bauer was pronounced deceased shortly after arriving at the hospital.

Two Pleasanton police officers were transported to Stanford Valley Care where they received medical treatment for their injuries and were released.

In-Custody Death Investigation

On Wednesday, August 1, 2018, at approximately 2:42pm, Pleasanton Police patrol officers were dispatched to 5420 Sunol Boulevard in Pleasanton regarding a disturbance inside the Raley's grocery store. A manager from the store called police after observing a white male adult in his thirties acting irrationally. The caller reported the male was picking up a shopping cart and slamming it to the ground and then opening and breaking bottles of alcohol. An employee told officers that she wanted the male placed under citizen's arrest for theft and vandalism as she feared for the safety of customers.

Officers arrived within four minutes of being dispatched and located the suspect in the 40 block of Mission Drive. When officer's attempted to detain the suspect, he did not comply with their multiple requests to place his hands behind his back. The suspect actively resisted officer's attempts to place him in handcuffs. Once the suspect was detained in handcuffs, an ambulance was called to transport him to Stanford Valley Care for routine medical clearance. As paramedics placed him into the ambulance, the suspect displayed signs of respiratory distress. Paramedics provided immediate medical aid and transported the suspect to Stanford Valley Care where life-saving measures were taken. He was pronounced deceased shortly after arriving at the hospital.

The involved officers were transported to Stanford Valley Care where they received medical treatment for their injuries and were released. The suspect's name is being held pending notification of family.

The Pleasanton Police Department, Alameda County District Attorney's Office, and the Alameda County Coroner's Office are conducting independent investigations into this incident.
