

The Aquatic Center is the perfect place to host a pool party! These reservable party areas are available for rent during weekend recreational swim hours. Party areas are directly next to each other. Single cove rental fee includes admission to pool for up to 20 guests. An additional 10 guests may pay admission fees upon arrival. Party area payment is due at time of reservation. Pool space may also be limited due to other programs. Parties over 30 guests must book both areas.

#### **GENERAL SAFETY RULES:**

- · No one is allowed in the pool area unless a lifeguard is on duty
- · Children under 10 years must be accompanied and closely supervised by a responsible adult (16 years or older)
- · Children ages 5 years and younger must be within arm's reach of a parent or guardian at all times
- · Be aware of pool depths at all times. Stay in water depth appropriate to your ability
- · No water wings/arm floats allowed. Life jackets must be US Coast Guard Approved
- · No diving in the shallow pools. Diving permitted only in diving well, only from the diving boards
- · No running. No shoving, pushing or general horseplay on decks
- · No jumping backwards into any pools
- · Do not call for help unless it's necessary
- · No prolonged underwater breath holding
- · The City of Pleasanton is not responsible for lost or stolen items. Do not bring valuables to the facility
- · Spectator fees apply to all who plan to stay within the facility
- · No children of the opposite gender over the age of 5 permitted in the respective locker rooms.

## **GENERAL HEALTH RULES:**

- · A swim diaper is required for all incontinent individuals, or those who are not toilet trained
- · Patrons are encouraged to shower before entering pools. No playing in the showers
- · Persons with diarrhea and persons who have had diarrhea within the prior 14 days shall not enter the pool water
- · Proper bathing attire is required, street clothes in place of a swimsuit is prohibited
- · Patrons with bandages, open wounds, sores, or infections will not be allowed into the pools
- · No spitting on the decks, in the water, or in the restrooms. Do not drink the pool water
- · No eating, drinking, or chewing gum inside the pools
- · No food or gum inside the locker rooms.

#### PROHIBITED CONDUCT:

- · No glass, alcoholic beverages, drugs, or persons under the influence allowed in the facility
- · Use of tobacco products or devices is prohibited within the facility. No smoking or vaping is allowed within the surrounding park or the parking lot
- · No selling, using, possessing, giving away, or being under the influence of alcohol or illegal drugs at any times while in the facility
- · No cell phones, Go Pros, or any other cameras allowed in the water and locker room. Pictures may not be taken at any time inside of the locker rooms
- · No person shall possess a weapon, air gun, bow and arrows, firecrackers, bombs, torpedoes, rockets or any other type of fireworks or pyrotechnics
- · No abusive, threatening, obscene, harassing, or insulting language or behavior towards staff or other participants
- · No engaging in any activity that is disruptive to participants or staff at any time
- · No engaging in any activity that causes damage to City property or equipment.

## **WATERSLIDE RULES:**

- · Patrons must be 48 inches tall, and able to ride the slide by themselves without assistance
- · Patrons must have beginner level swimming skills
- · Pregnant women and persons with heart conditions or back trouble should not go down the slide
- · Food or beverages are not allowed on the slide tower
- · Eyeglasses must be securely fixed to the patron with a head strap or held in hand
- · Jewelry or swimwear with exposed zippers, buckles, rivets, or metal ornamentation is not permitted
- · Patrons must wait for the lifeguard's start signal before beginning to go down the slide
- · Only 1 patron permitted on slide flume at a time
- · Do not run, dive, stand, kneel, rotate, or stop on the slide. Never form chains
- · Slide must be ridden feet first; lying on your back to go faster, sitting position to go slower
- · Always keep arms and hands inside the flume
- · At the end of the slide, obey the lifeguard and exit quickly. Do not block the end of the slide
- · No swimming or flotation devices are allowed in the splash-down area
- · Patron's weight must not exceed 300 pounds.

## **DIVING SAFETY RULES:**

- · No double bouncing on the diving boards
- $\cdot$  No jumping backwards, gainers, or spinning off the diving boards
- $\cdot$  No life jackets shall be worn jumping off the diving boards
- · One person at a time on diving boards; one person at a time on ladders
- · Do not dive until diving area is clear and all persons have reached the side
- · Swim to the nearest ladder at completion of dive; never swim under a diving board
- · Dives/divers determined by staff to be unsafe may be denied use of the diving well
- · Fulcrum should always be at its most forward position.
