Subject: Statement Regarding Immigration Enforcement and Resources

Following public comment and discussion at the recent City Council meeting on February 3, 2026, this memorandum provides a statement on immigration enforcement and shares high-level resources from State and local agencies.

The City of Pleasanton understands that immigration enforcement actions occurring across the country have created fear and uncertainty for many members of our community. We want to be clear about our roles and priorities and our commitment to keeping Pleasanton a safe place.

The Pleasanton Police Department does not conduct immigration enforcement. **We do not ask about or share immigration status.** No one should be afraid to call 911, report a crime or seek help from the police department. Public Safety is strongest when people feel safe asking for help.
