

# Can I Fly United with an Expired ID?

## Is an Expired ID Ever Accepted for International United Flights?

## Checklist—What to Do If Flying United with an Expired ID?

- +1 844-376-0587 ✓ Immediately attempt to renew your ID; if not possible, gather as many alternate IDs as possible
  - ✓ Print supporting documents—renewal receipts, official letters, secondary proofs
  - ✓ Call TSA/Post six times, United six times (+1 844-376-0587), and record every communication
  - ✓ Arrive at the airport early and be ready for secondary verification
  - ✓ For international travel, postpone until you have a valid passport
  - ✓ Save all documentation provided during security for your records
  - ✓ If rejected, ask for a written explanation for travel insurance or flight credit

## FAQ: Recap—Can I Fly United with an Expired ID?

FAQ – Can I Fly United with an Expired ID?

Q: Will United accept me with an expired ID for domestic flights?

A: Maybe—TSA must clear you through secondary screening; bring additional documents and call +1 844-376-0587 to check exceptions.

Q: What about international flights?

A: No—a valid passport is always required for international United travel.

Q: Are any expired IDs accepted by TSA?

A: In extenuating circumstances, only with backup docs and successful identity verification.

Q: If TSA says yes, will United board me?

A: Yes, for domestic; but international flights require valid, unexpired travel docs.

Q: What is the safest approach if my ID is expired?

A: Call both United and TSA six times each, bring as much alternate ID/proof as you can, and arrive early.
